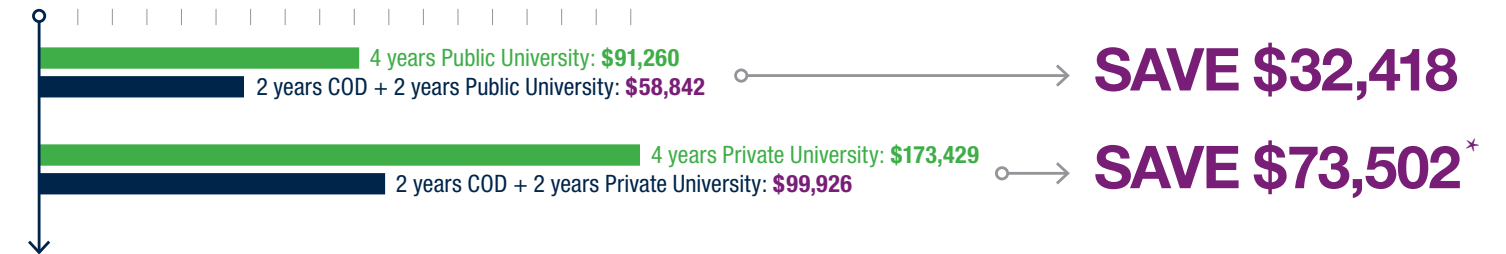

### HIGH-QUALITY ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Since opening our doors more than 50 years ago, COD has continually increased its credit offerings, now providing 75 Associate in Applied Science degrees in 43 different career and technical subject areas; 180 certificates in 55 different career and technical subject areas; out of nine degrees awarded by College of DuPage, seven are considered transfer degrees with the two most common being the Associate in Arts and the Associate in Science degrees.

### DEDICATED FACULTY

The cornerstone of the College's commitment to excellence in higher education is an experienced, nationally recruited faculty dedicated solely to teaching, not research. You are never taught by interns or teaching assistants. College of DuPage has a large enrollment but students experience a small average class size, allowing for personalized attention and hands-on training. Beginning your college career at College of DuPage is your most affordable choice. Our tuition and fees are extremely competitive. The College offers a flexible payment plan in addition to many forms of financial assistance, including scholarships, grants and loans.

Students who choose COD for their first two years of college will save more than \$32,000 compared to attending an in-state public university all four years, and more than \$70,000 compared to a private university! That's money in your pocket ... for the same degree.

### INNOVATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

The facilities on the College of DuPage campus are second to none. Our Health and Sciences Center (HSC) and Technology Education Center (TEC) are home to cutting-edge labs and instructional areas. COD is the only community college in the nation to have its own CT scanner.

Our Culinary & Hospitality Center (CHC) and Robert J. Miller Homeland Security Education Center (HEC) opened in 2011. The CHC provides our culinary and hospitality students with living laboratories—two restaurants, a retail operation and a boutique hotel—to hone their skills. And the HEC is home to our 4-D immersive street scene for training first responders as well as forensics labs and a smoke room. In fall 2015 COD opened the Homeland Security Training Center (HTC) that includes an indoor firing range and a call center training lab.

### ACCREDITATION

College of DuPage (COD) is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC), one of six regional accrediting agencies in the United States.

Regional accrediting agencies provide the most highly respected type of accreditation for colleges and universities, and are recognized by both the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). Some of the benefits of regional accreditation include eligibility to offer federal financial aid, acceptance of transfer credits by other regionally accredited schools, and assurance that the education is of a high-quality.

# ACADEMICS



Our academic programs are of the highest caliber. Each academic program at COD is designed to teach you to think critically, communicate effectively, and adapt creatively to change. More importantly, your COD education prepares you for success in your chosen career.

## EXPERIENCED FACULTY FOCUSED ON TEACHING

At COD, students learn from full- and part-time faculty members with a world of expertise—people who’ve dedicated their lives to teaching, who are global experts in particular disciplines with real-world, hands-on experience. The common denominator: Our faculty’s focus is not on researching and publishing but on teaching and inspiring our students. The focus on individual attention helps ensure student success.

Students at COD can earn one of nine associate degrees and transfer to a four-year college or university to complete a bachelor’s degree. Credits that you earn at COD are accepted at colleges and universities across the nation.

## TRANSFER DEGREES

**The Associate in Arts degree** represents the first two years of study for students who plan to pursue a Bachelor’s in Arts degree.

**The Associate in Science degree** represents the first two years of study for students who plan to pursue a Bachelor’s in Science degree.

**The Associate in Engineering Science degree** is intended for students who wish to prepare for transfer to a baccalaureate-granting school in the field of engineering.

**The Associate in General Studies degree** is designed for students who desire to arrange a program of courses to meet their personal interests.

**The Associate in Fine Arts degree** is intended for students who wish to prepare for transfer to a baccalaureate-granting school with a Bachelor in Fine Arts or Music program.

**The Associate in Applied Science degree** is intended for students who plan to pursue occupational or technical degrees.

**The Associate in Arts in Teaching Early Childhood Education degree** is designed for students who plan to transfer to earn a bachelor’s degree with Illinois Type 04 teaching certification.

**The Associate in Arts in Teaching Secondary Mathematics degree** is designed for students who plan to transfer to pursue a bachelor’s degree and teacher certification at the secondary level for mathematics.

## CAREER AND TECHNICAL PROGRAMS

Many COD programs prepare you to enter the work force in two years or less. You can earn an associate’s degree (Associate in Applied Science) or certificate in a business, health or technology area.

Career and Technical programs prepare students by providing both classroom knowledge and hands-on experience. These programs are taught by knowledgeable instructors with experience in the field and a curriculum designed in conjunction with advisory committees composed of industry professionals.

## ENGINEERING PATHWAYS

Offers qualified students guaranteed admission to the College of Engineering at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Benefits of the program include guaranteed admission upon completion of the program requirements, specialized advising, preparation for transferring as well as many others.

## ENHANCED 2+2 IN EDUCATION

An enhanced 2+2 agreement for Education that offers COD students a competitively priced, streamlined opportunity to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education from Lewis University in just four years.

Students in this program will pay COD tuition rates for their first four semesters. For semesters five to eight, Lewis will provide a discounted tuition rate that is 40 percent less than the university’s published undergraduate tuition.

Programs are accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) and approved for entitlement by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).

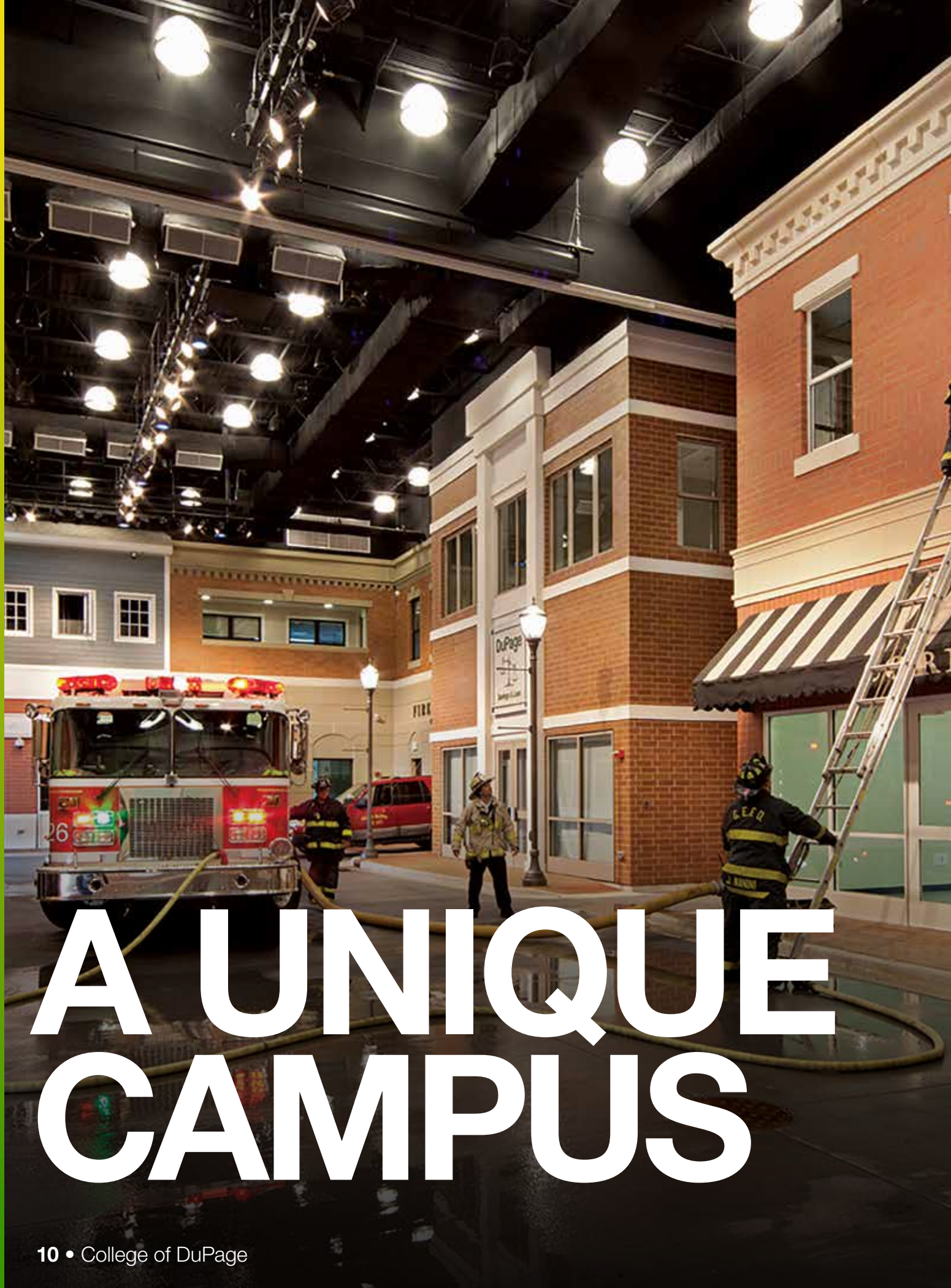

## AREAS OF STUDY DEFINITIONS

**3+1 Programs:** College of DuPage has partnered with prominent universities to offer high-caliber bachelor's degree programs at a greatly reduced cost. The programs are affordable, accessible, high quality, and offered on College of DuPage campus.

**Enhanced 2+2:** Enhanced 2+2 programs allow College of DuPage students to complete an Associate's degree, with emphasis on General Education courses plus additional credits towards a baccalaureate degree.

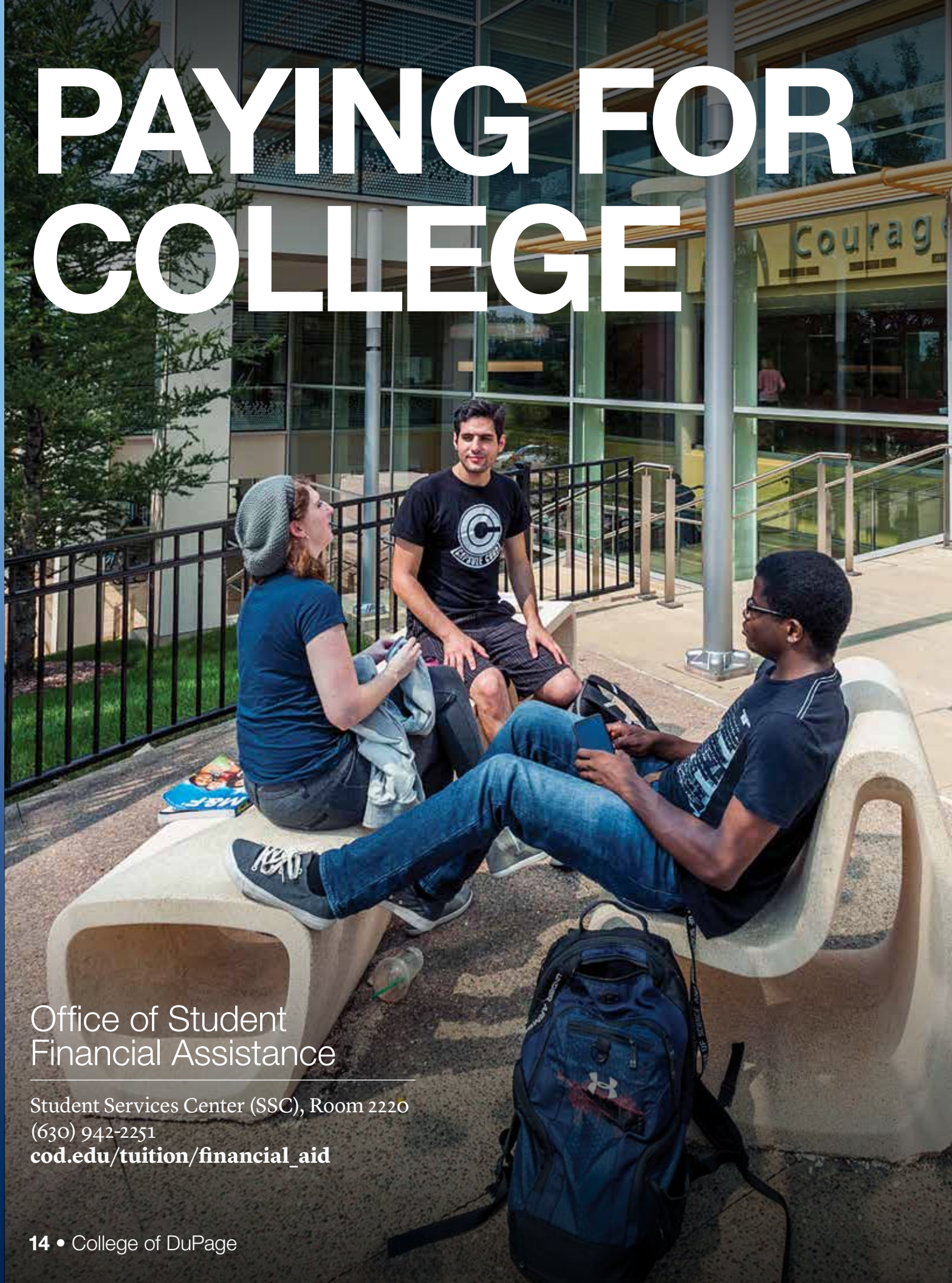
**2+2 Articulation Agreements:** 2+2 articulation agreements are signed between College of DuPage and four-year colleges and universities that allow students to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree at College of DuPage.

**Limited Enrollment:** Limited enrollment programs require either a separate application and/or the completion of specific prerequisites before acceptance into the program. These programs have limited availability.

**IAI Courses:** IAI is the acronym for the Illinois Articulation Initiative. The Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) works best for students who know they are going to transfer but are undecided on the college or university that will grant their baccalaureate degree. IAI is a statewide (General Education Course Curriculum (GECC) transfer agreement, which is valid among more than 100 participating colleges or universities in Illinois.

**Transfer Coursework:** Students can take coursework for college-level credit that may transfer to a four-year college or university (depending on the four-year institution) for courses completed at College of DuPage. Transfer coursework is articulated with at least three Illinois public institutions. Typically, students can transfer up to two years of coursework from COD toward an advanced degree (such as a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science) at another school.

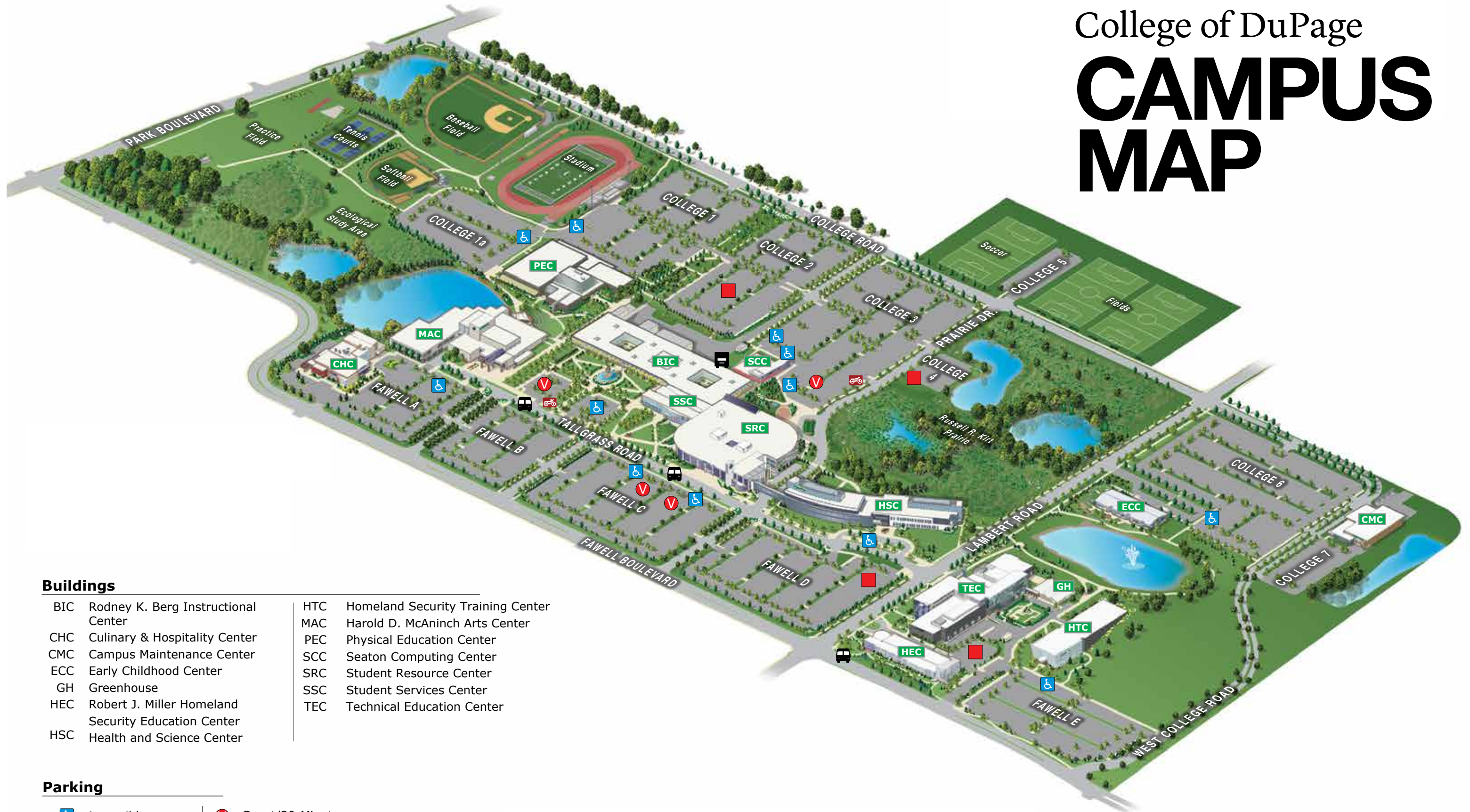
